### **The University of Colorado Ludeman Family Center for Women's Health Research and OCBN Collaborate on a Series Featuring Women's Health Issues**

Dateline August 5, 2022, Aurora CO: A collaboration has been finalized between the University of Colorado Ludeman Family Center for Women's Health Research and OCBN to produce a series on women's health issues. The Ludeman Center is regarded as one of the best places to conduct research that includes women and considers the distinct but linked concepts of sex (biological) and gender (social) differences.

The initial program is an overview of the organization by Dr Judy Regensteiner, the Ludeman Center's Co-Founder and Director and distinguished professor of medicine in the divisions of internal medicine and cardiology at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus. Dr Regensteiner is currently principal investigator for the National Institutes of Health's Building Interdisciplinary Research Careers in Women's Health (BIRCWH) grant and the Doris Duke Foundation's Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists. She is also on the NIH's Advisory Committee on Research on Women's Health. As director of the Ludeman Center, Dr. Regensteiner leads an interdisciplinary team of researchers who focus on women's health and sex differences research.

Future Programs will feature some of the nearly 90 researchers presenting in the three major area of Cardiovascular Disease, Diabetes / Metabolism, and Mental Health and the links between mental and physical health affected by these conditions. Program production was started on August 5, 2022.
